**NDSCS Men's Basketball team** ended their regular season with an overall record of 25-5 and 11-3 in the Mon-Dak Conference. They defeated Dawson Community College 78-65 in the semi-final matchup. The Wildcats were narrowly defeated by Williston State College, 77-71 in the Mon-Dak Conference championship. **NDSCS Women's Basketball team** ended with an overall record of 21-8. They ended conference play in second with a record of 11-3. Bismarck State College got the Wildcats in their first round of the regional tournament, 87-68.
