Alumna / Alumnus of the Year Criteria: award began in 1958

- Must have attended NDSSS/NDSCS as a full-time student for at least one quarter/semester.
- Accomplishments since attending or graduating from NDSCS
- Interest in education
- Reflects favorably on college
- Consideration should be given to his/her ability to connect with people or companies for support to NDSCS
- Show willingness to be charitable to NDSCS

Wildcat of the Year Criteria: award began in 1967

- Friend and supporter of NDSCS functions and programs
- Be an advocate and endorse the school administration, faculty and staff
- Willingness to render services and encouragement to students, campus activities, athletics, and other student groups
- Support the college at all times
- Willing to join in social and engagement opportunities on the NDSCS campuses
- Show willingness to be charitable to NDSCS

Parade Grand Marshall Criteria: award began in 1969

- Friend and advocate for the college
- Supports the college and their programs
- Renders encouragement and willing to serve when called upon
- Goodwill ambassador
- Willing to share time and reach out to others
- Show willingness to be charitable to NDSCS

NDSCS – A Family Tradition Criteria: award began in 1999

- Family continues to be ambassadors for NDSCS
- Provides support to the college through various means

- Significantly contributes to community/society
