The NDSCS Alumni Foundation along with many partners and friends celebrated the groundbreaking for the Career Innovation Center in South Fargo on July 7, 2021.

The Career Innovation Center (CIC), located at 4230 64th Avenue South in Fargo, N.D., is scheduled to open late 2022; and will provide a collaborative education and training solutions to meet regional workforce needs. Within the CIC, NDSCS will provide training and academic programming alongside Fargo Public Schools, West Fargo Public Schools, Central Cass School District, and Northern Cass School District. This centrally located education and training center will provide career awareness events for elementary students, career identification and preparation (including early-entry College classes) activities for middle and high school students, and training/learning spaces for NDSCS students and trainees.

The Alumni Foundation will own the building and will least it back to the College, as we have done in the past with the existing NDSCS-Fargo location.

The career academy concept has been a proven model to meet workforce needs within other communities; the CIC is projected to serve around 3,800 individuals annually from the Fargo region. When completed, the approximately 92,000 sq. ft. facility will include academic programming and training options related to: Construction; Information Technology; Health Science (including Nursing and Emergency Medical Technology); Manufacturing and Engineering; Business; Arts and Communication; Transportation; and Agriculture.



North Dakota Challenge Grant

The North Dakota Challenge Grant allows donations to the NDSCS Foundation to be matched by the state of North Dakota by 50%. Your gift can be up-front or pledged over a period of five years and still qualify for the matching funds. Many donors have used the Challenge Grant to start scholarships at NDSCS. For example, if you pledge \$25,000 over 5 years, your gift would be matched with the \$12,500 up front, and the scholarship, when the pledges are paid off, would be \$37,500. The Challenge Grant match is available to everyone, not just North Dakota residents. We are grateful to all the donors who have so

A Small Donation Can Make a BIG Impact

Open Educational Resources (OER) is a term that describes resources that are free to access online or are available to print for a very low cost. Often these resources have been developed by scholars, teachers, writers, and other experts – and are generally used in lieu of expensive textbooks. The use of OER has increased dramatically over the past several years and the NDSCS English Department has been leading the way – saving NDSCS students thousands of dollars.

Sybil Priebe, Associate Professor of English, Communication, and Performing Arts has been the leader in OER at NDSCS and throughout North Dakota. Along with her colleagues, she has developed two OER textbooks and work books that are used by English 120 and English 211 students. "This is one way I can help students – the cost of books and materials is overwhelming; especially for students that have financial barriers." Commented Sybil.

Although the OER materials are available for free online, some students do prefer to print a copy. "Some individuals are better able to learn when materials are printed" said Priebe. Another hurdle is some students do not have personal computers – but need to access their OER Textbook or workbook, accessing them on a phone or other smaller mobile device is difficult. It is these students who she is seeking to help. These students can print their OER materials at NDSCS for a reduced cost of \$15-20 per book.

Priebe is raising funds for her OER Printing fund. Funds raised will be used to off-set the cost of printing OER materials for students that prefer a printed copy.
